Dot Marinaccio has more than 35 years of experience in the disability field. She is the regional business relations coordinator for the Central NY Region of ACCES-VR, which includes the Southern Tier, Syracuse and Utica district offices. She has been with the agency for more than 29 years, serving for the first 13 years as a vocational rehabilitation counselor before joining the business relations team in 2001. In her current role, she works to build business partnerships, increase awareness of the skills and talents of job seekers with disabilities, and prepare job seekers to effectively marketing themselves to employers. She has been a certified ADA network trainer for the ADA National Network since 2007, and has provided training on various aspects of the Americans with Disabilities Act to agencies, businesses, and job seekers with disabilities. She obtained both her bachelor's in psychology and master's in counseling from the State University College at Oneonta.
